

What is Parkside aiming to achieve through its RE curriculum?

Religious Studies asks and provokes challenging questions about meaning and purpose of life, questions about God, ultimate reality, issues of right and wrong and what it means to be human.

Students will learn about religion by gaining knowledge of religious beliefs and practices and other worldviews. Students will gain an understanding of the diversity between and within religions, learn about the influence these beliefs have on individuals and communities and why these beliefs and practices are important to believers.

Students will also learn from religion within a local, national and global context where they will explore the validity of their own and others beliefs so that they can develop respect and tolerance.
